## Indians, Maidens Wind Up Season This Week-End

Pocahontas Community school basketball fortunes suffered setbacks in three of four varsity contests over the past week-end. Coach Gary Burns' Indians lost two while Coach Chuck Weatherwax's Maidens won one and lost one. The Indians lost to Manson Friday night here, 59 to 46, while the Maidens defeated the Manson girls, 49 to 33.

At Twin Rivers Saturday night, the locals registered their first doubleheader loss of the season with the Indians losing, 64 to 50, and the Maidens losing a two-pointer, 56 to 54.

This week-end will be another double date for the two teams and winds up the season for the locals. On Friday night they travel to Gilmore City-Bradgate for their final Twin Lakes conference games of the year, then Saturday night to Newell to make up the Dec. 22nd game postponed because of a snow-storm.

Led by balanced scoring from Jerry Hanson, John Boyd and Doug Anderson, the Indians led throughout much of the first half against Manson, holding a scant 29-28 halftime advantage. They faltered in the final two frames, however, and the visitors pulled away to their 13-point game-ending margin. Steve Hall led the scoring with 22 points.

The Indians' victory over Gilmore City-Bradgate gave them a 7-7 Twin Lakes conference mark for the season, good enough for a top division finish in the loop.

Coach Burns' crew led throughout the game, but never by any sizeable margin until the final minute when they built up a 40-31 lead. Then a rally by GC-B fell short, 40-38, at the buzzer.

Bob Topliff paced the losers' scoring with 9 points while John Boyd and Jerry Hanson hit 13 and 11 for the winners.

Saturday night, the Indians ran into a hot-shooting Newell quint that was not to be denied. The Red and White maintained the pace at the first quarter, but fell behind at halftime by 10 points, 36 to 26.

They just were never able to overcome the margin, despite 40 percent shooting. Newell, hitting at a 45 percent clip, was paced by four boys in double scoring figures. Three Pocahontas players, Hanson, Boyd and George Martens, were able to score 18, 17 and 13 respectively to end in that bracket.

After battling the Rams on even terms in the opening quarter, 8-8, the Indians fell behind, 24-16, at halftime. They came back to take over a 31-28 lead midway in the third quarter, but trailed throughout much of the remainder of the game.

Some timely shooting by Mike Calligan, who led all scorers for the night with 21 markers, and five consecutive free throws by Kenny Bennett in the nip and tuck fourth period brought victory to the Rolfe club.

Pocahontas, led by 16-point productions from both Doug Anderson and Jerry Hanson, could manage no better than a 28 percent field goal shooting average for the game. Rolfe limited to fewer shots, hit at a 48 percent clip.

Coach Weatherwax's Maidens, playing without the services of Forward Karen Johnson, managed to overcome a first-quarter 5-8 deficit and eke out a 25-23 half-time lead before exploding in the final two periods to win, 70-42.

Donna Clark had one of her hottest nights, sinking 18 of 21 free throws, and 12 field goals for the game's high of 42 points. Darla Henrichsen added 16 and Diane Johnson, filling in at the other forward spot, notched 10.

Kaye Smith, Helen Gunderson and Betty Jo Marine gave Coach Jack Head's Rolfe team balanced scoring with 16, 15 and 11 points respectively.

The Pocahontas girls scored a whopping 30 points in the fourth quarter of Friday's game after leading, 40 to 32, at the beginning of the period. The win gave them a 14-2 mark for the season.

High-scoring Rich Fullerton hit 21 for the winners with two other lanky team-mates, Schulze and Opheim hitting 12 each. For Pocahontas Jerry Hanson had 19 and Doug Anderson 16 to look best offensively. The loss was the Indians' third in a row and gave them an 8-8 mark in season's play to date.

## CHS Beats Pocahontas

Rolfe Pocahontas Catholic shook off its case of jitters first and beat cross-town rival Pocahontas High school in a roughly-played first round sectional contest here Tuesday night, 45-36.

It is believed to be the first time the two schools have ever met in basketball.

Because of the pressure neither team played as well as they have during the season, especially in the first half when at times there were more bad passes than good ones.

The Eagles lost the services of Mike Eichler for most of the second half when he rejured an ankle. He appeared briefly in the second half but stayed on the floor only about a minute.

Both teams settled down somewhat in the second half and the Indians made a comeback in the early moments of the fourth period that cut the Eagles' lead to four points at 35-31 on two quick field goals by Ron Meeske who ended up the game's high scorer with 17 points.

The losers stayed within five to seven points until the final minute of play when Ron Drobney hit seven seconds from the end.

Both teams lost players on fouls. Pocahontas High lost Tom Mick with 7:35 to play and Pocahontas High lost Tom Mick with 7:35 to play and Pocahontas Catholic lost Neil Peterson with 3:05 left.

POCAHONTAS High held its only lead at 2-0 on Meeske's set shot from the outside. Seconds later Peterson dumped in a jump shot to tie the game and two free throws by Drobney and another fielder by Peterson gave the winners the lead for good.

The Eagles had a 19-9 lead late in the second period and took a 19-12 lead by halftime.

IN THE third period Pocahontas Catholic led, 23-14 before three straight free throws cut it to 23-17. Later, with the score 28-20, Jerry Hanson scored from the circle, Meeske pushed in another one and the lead was cut to 28-24.

The Eagles' superior speed was the difference in the end as they stole several passes and used reserves Mike Rigby and Shors for late buckets.

Pocahontas Catholic will play Pomeroy Thursday night at 8:30 p. m. in the second of two semifinal games here. In the first game Gilmore City meets Newell.

A crowd of about 800, mostly from Pocahontas, watched the game.
