Coach Don Conley's Pocahontas Indians pleased a large Homecoming crowd here last Friday night by fourth-quartering the Twin Rivers Pirates, 14 to 0. It was a game of defenses until the Red and White broke it open in the final period on a long scamper by Senior Jerry Hanson and a pair of intercept-

ed passes, one of which was converted to the second TD.

The two teams, now with identical conference records of 1-4, were evenly matched throughout the first 3 periods. Twin Rivers had marched close to pay dirt just before halftime, gave up the ball on a fumble, but recovered an Indian bobble to press the locals with their backs to the goal-line a second time.

They captured an errant Indian pass with just seconds left and threatened once again, but the stalwart Warriors held.

The third period was played in mid-field in see-saw fashion until Pocahontas put together an offensive attack which rolled 60 yards to the Twin Rivers nine. There the Pirates held and booted out of danger.

The Indians put together a pair of first downs and finally Jerry Hanson skirted right end from 40 yards out to put the locals ahead. Martens added the (Continued on page 7)

point after touchdown through tackle.

Any Twin Rivers hope of knotting the score on the final series of plays was thwarted when John Boyd latched onto a short pass in Pirate territory to set up the second Indian TD. A pair of roughness penalties helped the local cause and Geo. Martens burst through the line from three yards out to tally the clincher. He also added the PAT through the line.

Offensively, Martens and Elroy Panbecker were outstanding for Coach Conley's charges. They chalked up 80 and 70 yards respectively. Hanson, Bob Payer and Jack Mayberry starred on defense. Hanson accounted for two of Pocahontas' three pass thefts.

For the visitors, Fullerton looked good defensively along with Schulze while the Nielsen twins, Ron and Don, accounted for the bulk of the visitors' yardage.

Games This Week

The Indians will play their final two matches of the season in the next week. This Friday, they wind up their home schedule against fading Albert City-Truesdale and next Wednesday, they travel to Gilmore City-Bradgate for the finale. A pair of wins could boost their mark to 4-4 for the season. This Friday, Rolfe hosts Twin Rivers, Rockwell City plays at Laurens and Gilmore City-Bradgate travels to Manson.

In games last week, Laurens had trouble with Gilmore City-Bradgate, 7 to 0, last Wednesday night while Manson rolled 27 to 7 over Albert City-Truesdale and Rolfe upset favored Rockwell City, 19 to 12, on Friday.

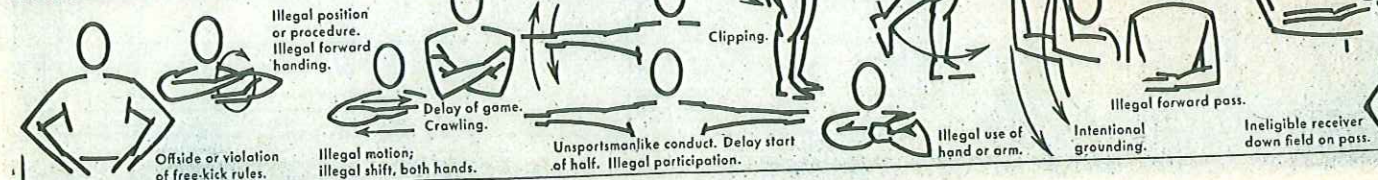
