

Rockwell City Repeats as T.L. Track Champs

Rockwell City repeated as champions of the Twin Lakes conference track and field meet held at Storm Lake Tuesday evening. They outscored runner-up Manson, 86½ to 80, to capture the team title for the second year running.

Laurens finished third, Gilmore City-Bradgate fourth and Pocahontas fifth with Twin Rivers, Rolfe and Albert City-Truesdale following in that order.

Four records fell in the meet, three in field events. Two of those were held by former Pocahontas thinclads. Ralph Hudek's 1957 mark in the shotput was bested by Larry Leist of Rockwell City and Howard Johnson's 1955 pole vault record was cleared by Bob Ziegler of Laurens and Bill Grant of Rockwell City.

Leist also wiped the discus record off the books while Pocahontas' Dick Bergstrom shaved a half second off the half-mile run mark with a time of 2:06.3. Bergstrom was also a double winner. He won the mile run in a time of 4:40.9, less than two seconds short of the record.

Coach Don Conley's other point-getters included: George Martens in a four-way tie for second in the high jump, Jerry Hanson with a third in the 440-yd. dash, the two-mile relay team consisting of Leroy and Arvin Nelson, Rog Hutchinson and John Boyd, with a third place, Jack Mayberry fifth in the pole vault and John Boyd fifth in the low hurdles.
